

# Info Sheet: Intro to CQI Cupping

## **Overview**

The AFCA Coffee Campus Uganda presents Intro to Cupping together with Q Instructor, Clare Rwakatogoro. This is a paid course through the African Fine Coffees Association (AFCA), and is a 200-level Coffee Quality Institute (CQI) Quality Evaluation certificate course. Course details from CQI and AFCA registration requirements are listed below.

**Course Description:** In this three-day class, attendees will learn the fundamental mechanics of olfaction (Fragrance & Aroma), gustation (Flavor & Aftertaste), taction (Body & Mouthfeel), and aroma memory recall. We will apply these fundamental mechanics while learning how to compare and describe coffee attributes, how to determine the proper weights and measures of a cupping bowl, and to set up a cupping table. We will cup multiple flights of coffee and calibrate our evaluations.


An attendee actively participating in this class will know how to properly set up and conduct cuppings with globally recognized protocols. They will also begin to learn the common language of coffee quality descriptors and ways to continue increasing their knowledge and usage.

**Who is it for?** People working in the coffee sector who wish to further their understanding of cupping and/or describing coffee. People who need to build the skills necessary to become professional cuppers. Uganda nationals and Africa-based coffee professionals are encouraged to take part in the course.

**About the Instructor:** Clare Rwakatogoro is a coffee quality expert and licensed Q Robusta Instructor with CQI. Clare worked for the Uganda Coffee Development Authority (UCDA) for 17 years and formed part of the team that developed the Q Robusta protocols at the UCDA Lab together with CQI. With nearly 20 years of experience in coffee quality control, Clare is also a Q Arabica Assistant Instructor, Barista Trainer, and Certified World Barista Sensory Judge (2011-2012). She has taught Q Robusta courses in Uganda, Kenya, Switzerland, and Scotland.
